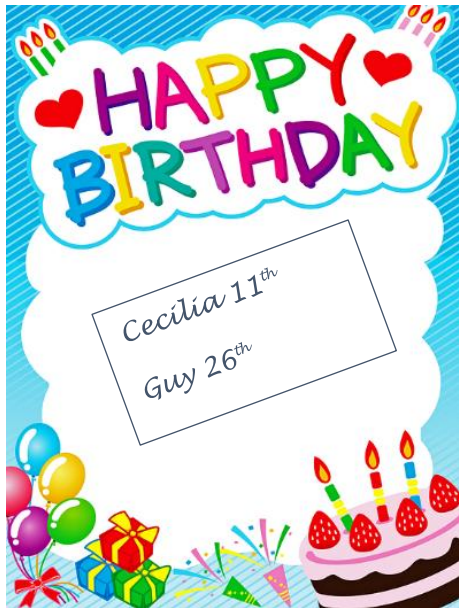




AUGUST 2022 NEWSLETTER
